1. What is it about Mr Murdstone that makes David frightened when he looks at him? Give three details. [3 marks]

2. Write down two words suggested by the name 'Murdstone'. In each case, explain what your choice indicates about a person with that name. [4 marks]

3. Why is David so frightened on this particular day that he forgets all his lessons? Give three reasons. [3 marks]

4. Look at the paragraph beginning, *Miss Murdstone watched me fiercely* Why does David describe Miss Murdstone as 'a metallic lady'? Give detailed reasons for your answer, and make sure you think about the whole paragraph. [3 marks]

5. David tells us that Mr Murdstone took him upstairs 'as if he were escorting a criminal to the gallows'. What does this simile suggest about Mr Murdstone's attitude to the punishment he is about to give? [3 marks]

6. David bit right through Mr Murdstone's hand. Try and think of two reasons why David acted so viciously? [2 marks]

7. David felt guilty for biting his tutor. In your opinion, was he wrong to bite Mr Murdstone, or was his action justified? Give reasons for your answer. [2 marks]

8. Close to the end of the passage, David describes his room as 'a prison'. Give three reasons why he might think this. [3 marks]

9. Look again at the last four paragraphs. Find two pieces of evidence which suggest that the Murdstones have taken control of David's mother's household. [2 marks]

10. David goes through a range of emotions in the passage. Write down two, and explain in your own words what causes each. [4 marks]

11. Most readers will find this story disturbing. Choose two disturbing features of the story, and briefly explain your choice in each case. [4 marks]
