1. Tom believes that danger “stalked” in the woods. Explain what you think he means by the word “stalked”. [1 mark]

2. In paragraph 1, Tom imagines the dangers that exist in the woods. Name **two** of the dangers that he expects to see. [2 marks]

3. We are told that Tom’s eyes “burned” on line 3.

- a) Explain what you think “burned” means here. [1 mark]

- b) What emotion is Tom feeling that makes his eyes burn? [1 mark]

4. In paragraph 2, the area between the building and the fence is made to seem unpleasant for Tom. Find **two** pieces of evidence that suggest the area is unpleasant and then explain in each case why it seems unpleasant. [5 marks]

5. We are told that Gandy's face is "upside-down" on line 12. Explain why this might be. [2 marks]

6. On line 26 we are told that Tom is scared. Explain why the fence scares him at this point. [2 marks]

7. Look at lines 30 - 38. Find **two** pieces of evidence that show the wild trees seem threatening. In each case, explain **in your own words** what makes the trees seem so threatening. [5 marks]

8. The trees that Tom has come across in Nature Parks are described as “tamed” on line 32. Suggest what might have been done to tame them. [2 marks]

9. Explain **in your own words** why Gandy’s arms are described as “iron bars” on line 44. [2 marks]

10. On lines 56 - 57, we are told that Gandy gives Tom “an odd look . . . as if there was some thing he wasn’t sure whether to say or keep hidden”. Explain what you think Gandy is keeping hidden from Tom. [2 marks]

11. In lines 75 - 79, Tom is left alone in the forest.

- a) Find **two** pieces of evidence that show the forest seems more friendly in this paragraph. Then explain **in your own words** why these descriptions make the forest seem friendly. [5 marks]

- b) Give a reason why Tom “couldn’t believe” (line 78) the forest was truly friendly. [1 mark]

12. Tom's world is different from ours. Thinking about the passage as a whole, find **two** ways in which the world Tom lives in is different from our world. [2 marks]

13. Tom is convinced throughout that his grandfather is "old and mad" (line 81).

- a) Find **two** pieces of evidence in the passage as a whole, that show Tom thinks his grandfather is mad. [2 marks]

- b) Explain why Tom might believe that his grandfather is mad. [3 marks]

- c) Suggest a reason that shows Gandy **isn't** mad. [1 mark]

14. On line 80, we are told that Tom “wanted to go home very badly”. What makes Tom decide to stay? Explain your reasoning carefully **in your own words**. [4 marks]

15. Looking at the passage as a whole, find **two** examples of what Tom says to Gandy that shows he speaks to him in a commanding way. [2 marks]

16. Gandy goes through a range of emotions towards Tom in the passage. Identify **two** of Gandy’s feelings towards Tom and explain in each case why he feels this way towards Tom. [5 marks]
